### LAST CALL FOR APPLICATIONS!

The Oswego Police Department will hold a new session for the Citizens Police Academy (CPA) beginning February 5<sup>th</sup>. Classes will be held on Wednesday nights from 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm at the Police Department and will run for 13 weeks. Eligible applicants must be 18 years of age, reside in, own property, or operate a business within the Village. ### Cell Phone Law

Did you know ... Using or even holding an electronic device while driving is a moving violation? Three such offenses in a year will result in a suspended license. Previously, drivers would receive a warning ticket for the first offense and any subsequent tickets were non-moving violations. This law took effect on July 1, 2019.

In addition to the moving violation, a person who violates the law will be fined a maximum of \$75 on the first offense, \$100 on the second offense, \$125 on the third offense and \$150 for all future offenses.
