Did You Know?

Dogs and Other Domestic Animals – Warm weather is upon us. When you are out walking your pet please be courteous and keep your pet on a leash and pick up after them. Keep in mind the following two sections from the Village Ordinance:

No domestic animal shall be on any public area within the village unless restrained by a leash ... no longer than six feet (6').

Section 6-4-2: RUNNING AT LARGE

All animal excrement deposited outside the owner's property shall immediately be removed and disposed of properly by the individual in custody of the animal.

Section 6-4-8: ANIMAL EXCREMENT

Independence Day Fireworks

Bring your blankets and lawn chairs and get ready for a show, 6 ft. apart! Oswego's annual Fourth of July Fireworks Display will be held at dusk, approximately 9:00 p.m., on Saturday, July 4, 2020, at Prairie Point Park. The rain date is scheduled for Sunday, July 5. Limited parking will be available at the park, itself. In the interest of public safety, all patrons are required to adhere to the following policies at all times:



- Do not enter event if feeling ill or have been directed to self-quarantine within the last 14 days
- Wear face masks covering your nose and mouth
- Maintain 6 ft. of social distance between your family and others

Prairie Point Community Park is located at 4120 Plainfield Road, between Plainfield and Grove Roads. Parking is available at Oswego Public Works, the Oswego Senior Center rear lot, Eastview Elementary/District #308 Administration Center, Traugher Junior High School, Eastview Elementary, Prairie Point Elementary, and Oswego High School.

Traffic and parking restrictions will be in effect on streets surrounding the park prior to and immediately following the fireworks. Temporary 'no parking' signs will be posted and enforced at various locations. To alleviate congestion, traffic patterns will be changed at several intersections around the park.

Oswego police officers, community service officers, and police explorers will be located at intersections to direct traffic. Please consider carpooling, and we ask that you remain patient while traffic is clearing.

No alcoholic beverages are permitted. While dogs are permitted, pet owners are reminded that many dogs are frightened by fireworks, and that the Fourth of July is the biggest day of the year for lost dog reports. Often, it is best to leave your pet home, in a quiet and secure environment.

Plans for this event are subject to change at any time, per Governor's orders.
