First Responder Memorial

A groundbreaking ceremony was held on May 21st, 2020 for the Oswego First Responder Memorial. Local resident, Logan Goodbred designed and created the Memorial as part of his process in becoming an Eagle Scout. The Memorial is intended to honor and recognize local first responders for their service to the community.

Logan has partnered with the Oswego Fire Protection District, Oswego Police Department, and the Village of Oswego for support in fundraising and in-kind contributions of goods and services, focusing on "green" and sustainable materials.
