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### Census 2020

The Census Bureau conducts the decennial census via two overall operations:

- **Self-Response**
- **Non-response Follow-up**



Self-response has been taking place since March, even throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, with householders filling out the census questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail. The nationwide self-response rate is just over 62%.

For every household that does not self-respond, the Census Bureau strives to meet its goal of counting everyone by sending a census enumerator to the non-responding households to enumerate the residents in person. It is important that everyone responds to the Census.

Census enumerators began going door to door in our area on July 30<sup>th</sup>. They will have an ID, a Census-branded bag, and a tablet. Please be respectful to them as they are hired from our own neighborhoods and they are simply trying to do the job they were hired to do. It is also important to note that they are not bound by our solicitor ordinance. If you did not complete your 2020 Census yet, expect a knock on the door. ### Solicitor Ordinance

Every person or entity desiring to engage in peddling, soliciting or itinerant merchandising for commercial gain within the village is hereby required to make written application for a license, unless otherwise exempted. An annual solicitor license is valid for one (1) year from the date in which it is issued, while the monthly license is valid for thirty (30) days. Issued licenses are nontransferable.

Anyone securing a solicitor license must adhere to the homeowner or resident restriction notice of solicitation as well as the permitted hours of operation as identified in Chapter 9 of the Oswego, IL Code of Ordinances.
